Learning challenge

- **RISE Goals for Students**
 - Allows students opportunities to reflect on personal growth and development
- **Challenges**
 - Integrate reflection with the learning experience
 - Capture the moment, keep the momentum
 - Essay papers: creativity?
 - Discussion board: some interactions, multiple discussion leads, too structured



My solution: ePortfolios (HIP)

- ePortfolios are personal websites that:
 - Communicate and showcase skills, experiences, and learning
 - Contain diverse artifacts — documents and media
 - Contextualize those artifacts for potential employers, graduate schools, etc.

- Automatic account/page (at IU)
- Integrated in Canvas
- Easy to use
- User friendly interface
- Useful add-ons/tools
- Mobile app
- Prior experience
- Public
- Building personal relationships



Implementation tip 1: Clear expectations

- **Syllabus**
 - **ePortfolio (25%)**: This assignment requires individual students to create ePortfolios using the personal page on CN Post.



Implementation tip 2: transparent assignment

1. Multiple deadlines
2. Tasks
3. Rubrics
 - Layout and readability
 - Navigation
 - Graphics/multimedia
 - Reflections
 - mechanics



Building ePortfolios

1. Enable CN Post on Canvas
On Canvas, Settings → Navigation → Enable CN Post
2. Activate CN account
Click CourseNetworking (CN Post) on the course navigation
3. Entering the personal page
Click your name, the pencil icon, or “Go to My CN ePortfolio”
4. Start building the ePortfolio!



Building ePortfolio: design issues

- Prebuilt sections
 - Titles and contents can be edited.
 - Can be moved up or down
 - Cannot be removed
 - Abilities to adjust visibility of “Social Engagements”, “Following”, and “Followers”
- Flexibilities to add new sections in “**Showcases, Work Examples, etc.**”
 - Can be edited
 - Website building experience: images, videos, links, etc.
 - **Creativity shines!**



Getting access to student ePortfolios

- Click the three line bar to reveal the CN Post menu
- Click **Roster**
- Click the individual name

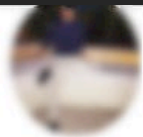

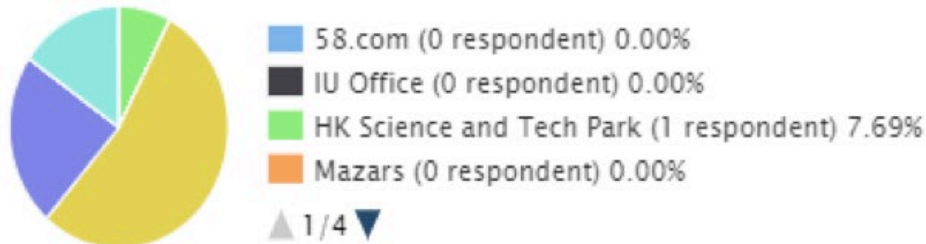

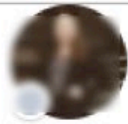
