### IUPUI Open Access Policy

In the five years since the IUPUI Faculty Council voted to adopt the campus-wide [Open Access Policy](#), faculty authors and IUPUI University Library’s Center for Digital Scholarship have made over 10,000 scholarly articles freely available to the public through IUPUI ScholarWorks. As a result, these articles have been downloaded over 1 million times by readers from around the world.

IUPUI’s commitment to open access benefits academic researchers, citizen scientists, and the public by allowing access to articles that may otherwise be prohibitively expensive to read. Supporting open access as an institution offers IUPUI the unique opportunity to invest in research as a communication tool, which can create faster scientific breakthroughs and improve human lives. 

### What About Copyright?

The overwhelming majority (81%) of publishers permit authors to make a version of their article open access with no fees required in university repositories like IUPUI ScholarWorks.<sup>1</sup> But, just in case, the policy also ensures that authors have the rights to share the accepted version of their article. Faculty have retained the right to share the author’s manuscript with any changes made as a result of the peer review process, but prior to publisher’s copy-editing or formatting.


### Opt-Out

The opt-out provision ensures that all faculty authors have the freedom to publish in the journal of their choice. Faculty authors may choose to make an article openly accessible in the institutional repository or to opt out by completing a short form on the [IUPUI Open Access Policy](#) website.
