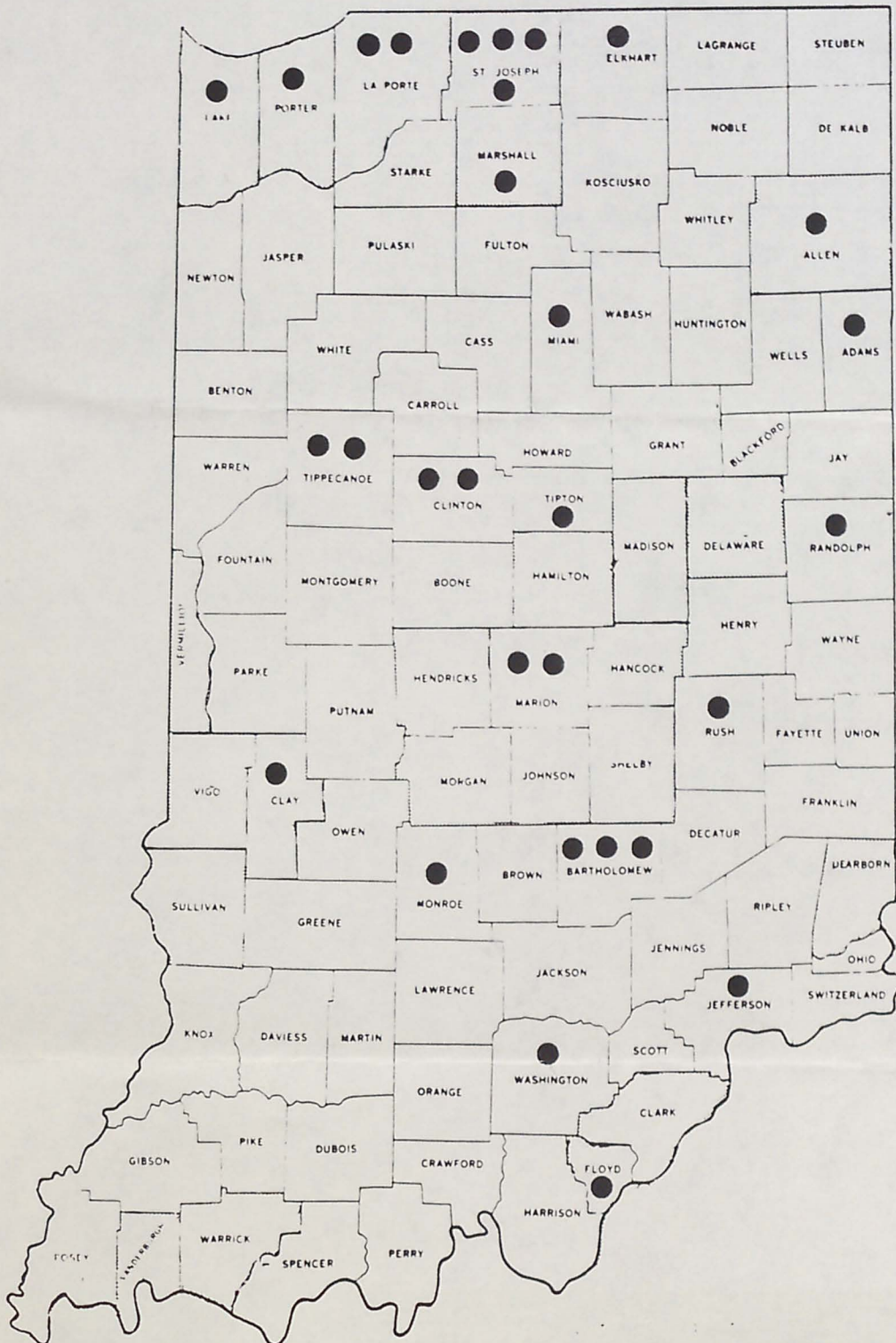

This year's objectives include:

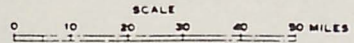
1. Plan the 1990 Summer Institute

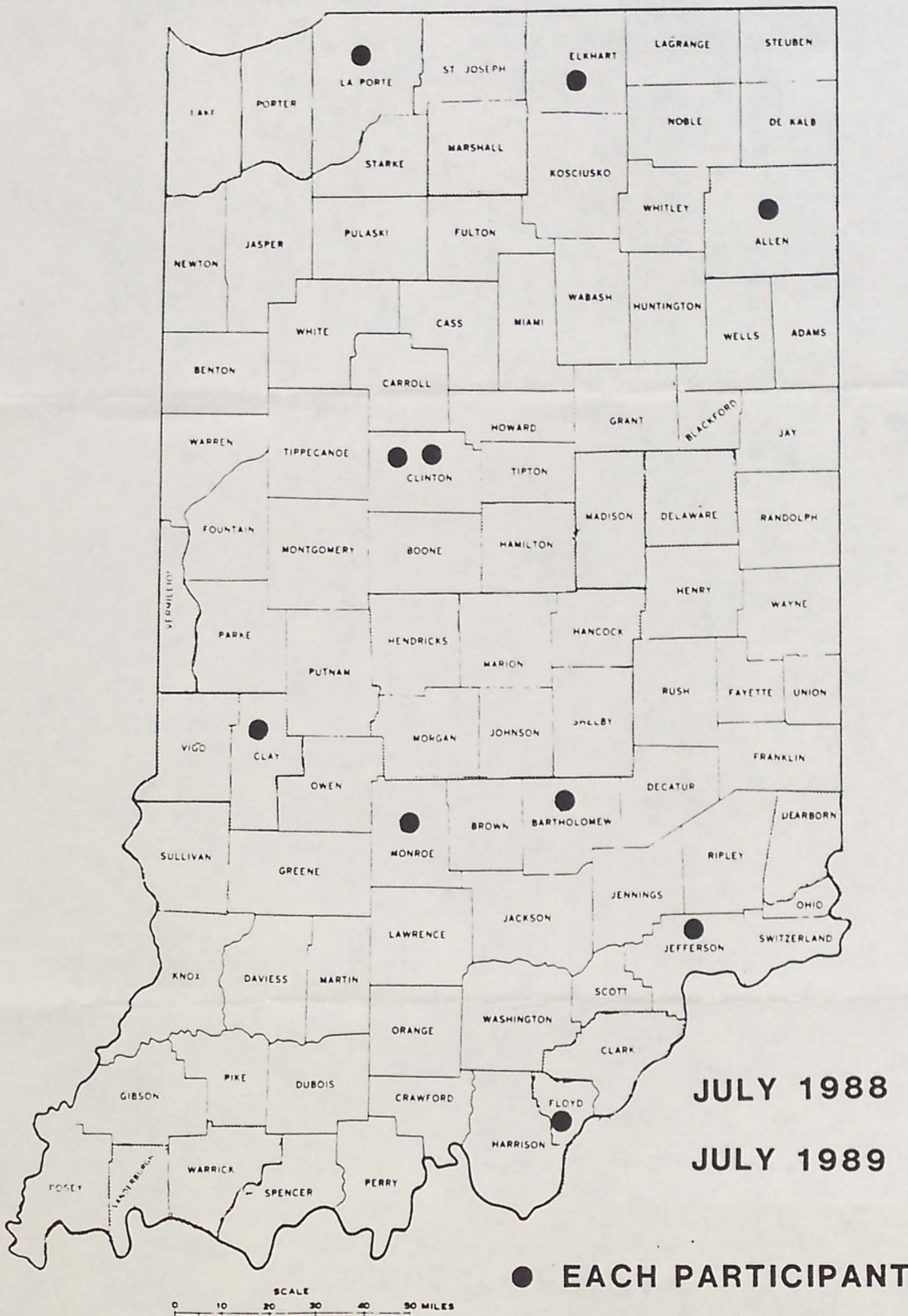

● EACH PARTICIPANT

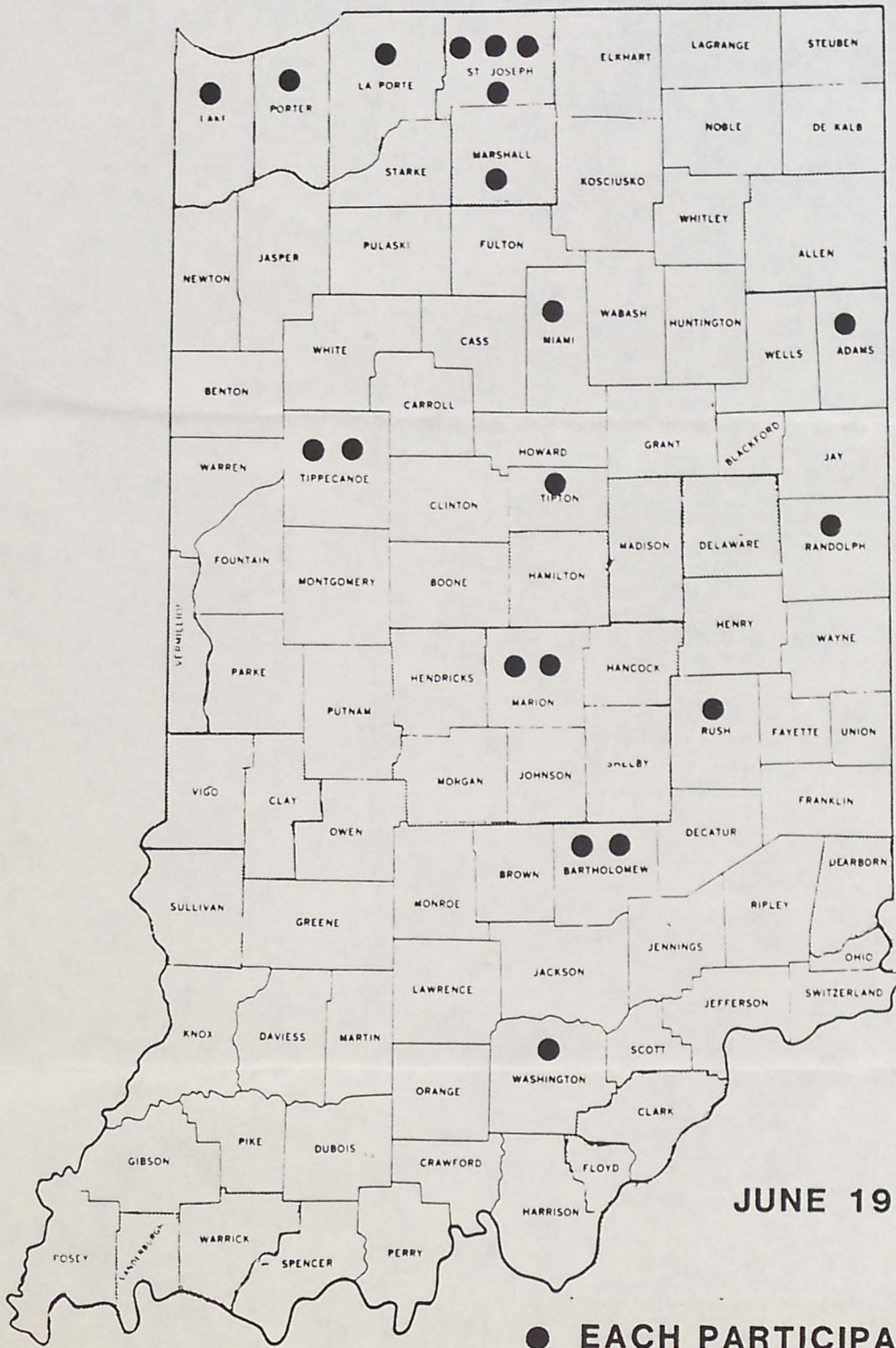


INDIANA AND WASHINGTON D. C. INSTITUTE PARTICIPANTS

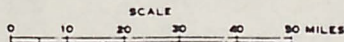


WASHINGTON D.C. INSTITUTES 1988 & 1989 PARTICIPANTS

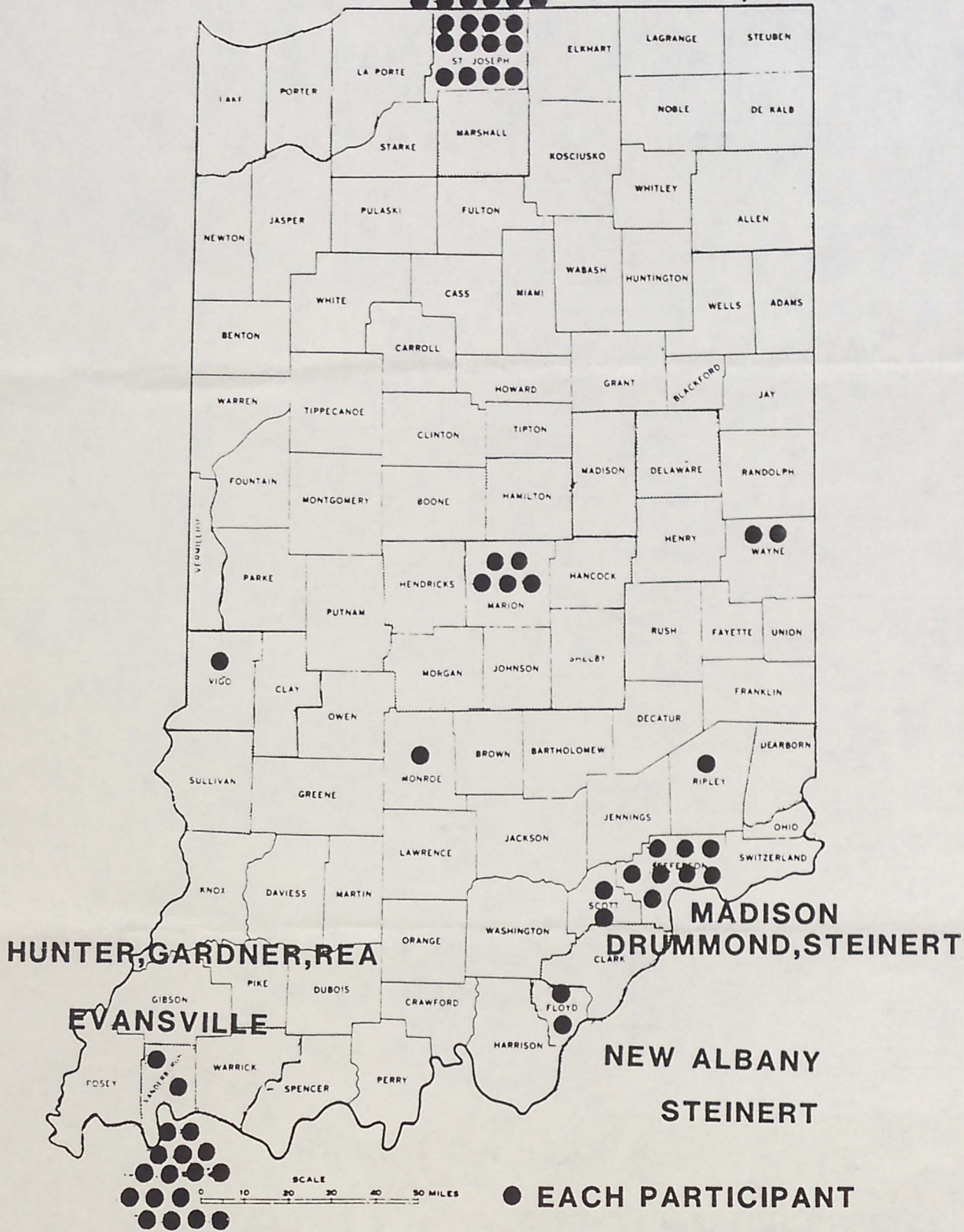

INDIANA SUMMER GEOGRAPHY INSTITUTE 1989 PARTICIPANTS

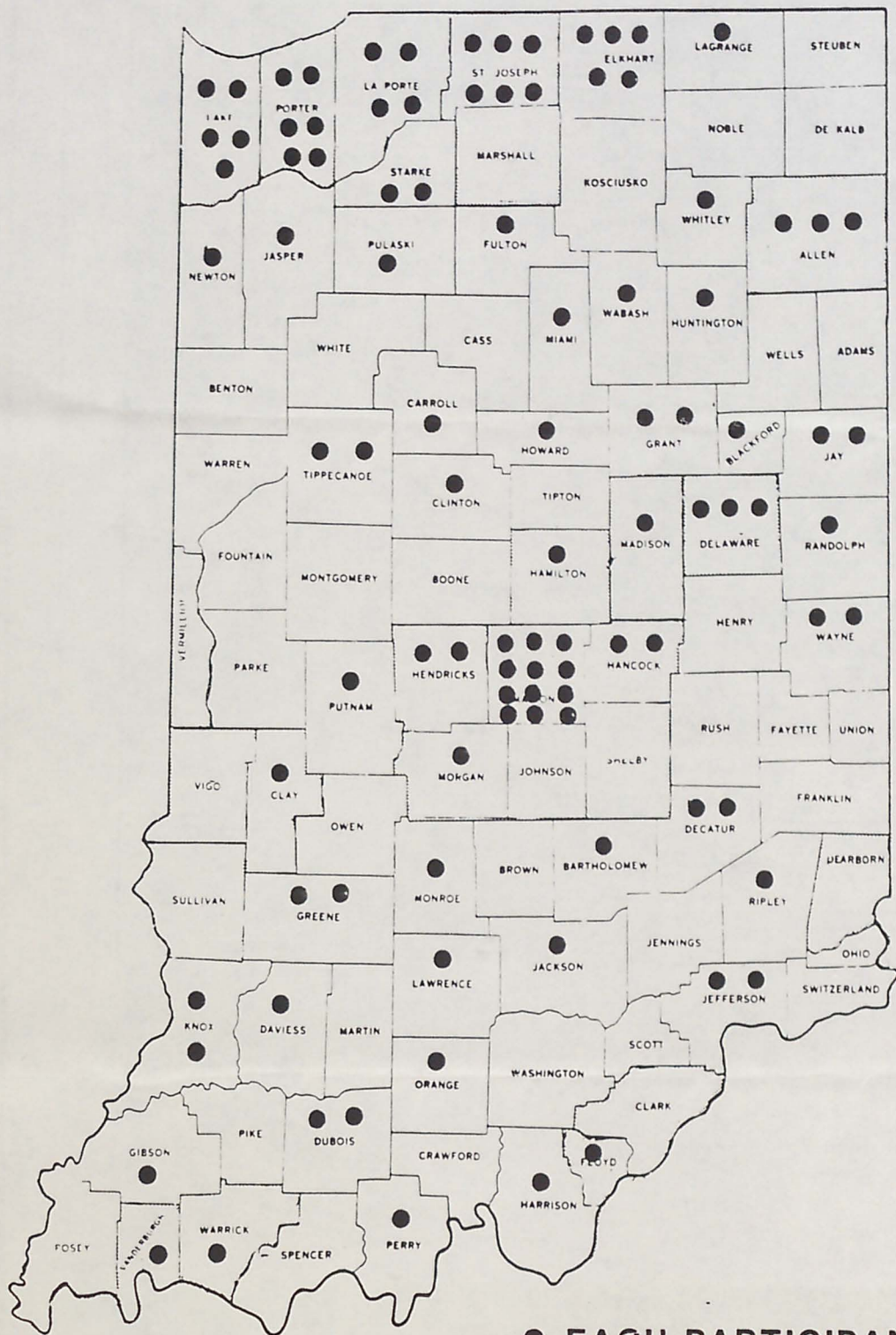

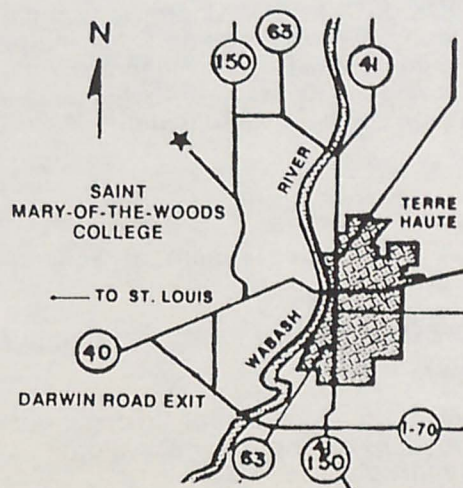
